

**UNDISCLOSED FILES OF THE POLICE (Black Dog & Leventhal, September 27, 2016)** is an evocative survey of New York City's past, as seen through the lens of its most horrific and shocking moments in crime. The riveting collection also provides a revealing look at the evolution of the largest and one of the oldest police departments in the country, from three insiders: a retired New York Police Department detective, an active NYPD lieutenant, and a *New York Post* crime reporter.

The book details more than 175 years of New York's most startling and unsettling crimes culled from the city's police blotter. Perfect for crime buffs, urban historians, readers of true crime, and fans of *Serial* and *Making of a Murderer*, UNDISCLOSED FILES OF THE POLICE is told through behind-the-scenes analysis of investigations and more than 500 rarely seen images, including mug shots, reports, crime scenes, and evidence.

From atrocities that occurred before the establishment of New York's police force in 1845, through the terrorist attack on the World Trade Center in 2001, to the present day, this visual history looks at more than 80 real-life crimes that shocked the nation, from arson to gangland murders, robberies, serial killers, bombings, and kidnappings, including:



- Architect Stanford White's fatal shooting at Madison Square Garden over the deflowering of a teenage chorus girl.
- The anarchist bombing of Wall Street in 1920, which killed 39 people and injured hundreds more with flying shrapnel.
- The 1928 hit at the Park Sheraton Hotel on mobster Arnold Rothstein, who died refusing to name his shooter.
- Kitty Genovese's 1964 senseless stabbing, famously witnessed by dozens of bystanders who did not intervene.
- Son of Sam, a serial killer who eluded police for months while terrorizing the city, was finally apprehended through a simple parking ticket.

**Bernard J. Whalen** is a lieutenant in the NYPD, where he has served for more than 34 years. He has published two books, *The NYPD's First Fifty Years* and the novel *Justifiable Homicide*. He lives in New York.

**Philip Messing** has been a journalist who has covered crime and law enforcement for more than 35 years. He is a veteran staff reporter for the *New York Post* and lives in New York.

**Robert Mladinich** is a retired NYPD detective, who was named Cop of the Year for the South Bronx in 1985. He has written a number of true crime books, including *From the Mouth of the Monster: The Joel Rifkin Story*, as well as articles for magazines including *Playboy* and *Details*. He is also the writer/editor for *Frontline*, a publication of the NYC Sergeants Benevolent Association. He lives in New York.
